### Minutes of Parish Council Meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> February 2019

#### 1. Apologies

#### 2. Public Participation

There were no members of the public present.

Police – the clerk read a report received from PCSO Cocks stating that from 1st to 31st January there had been 2 crimes. A drink drive and criminal damage to a vehicle.

Numerous patrols have been conducted around the Parish and all was found to be in order.

#### 4. Matters Arising

- Drains below Bury Down – these have been cleaned by BT.
- Japanese knotweed – with regard to the crop by the entrance to the sewage farm, Cornwall Council are happy for SWW to cut back.
- Potholes – none at present.
- Dog fouling – signage to go ahead at football pitch.
- BT manhole cover lifting at Court Meadow causing a trip hazard – it was unsure whether this has been repaired.
- B3359 – signage has been put on the list for Cornwall Council.
- Children waiting for bus – it has been agreed that children waiting for the bus will now wait at the post box/millennium building. The recent survey carried out has highlighted that parishioners would use a bus service if this was introduced to the village.

#### 5. Correspondence

Correspondence was noted. The Local Maintenance Partnership was discussed and agreed that the clerk pursue this with Cornwall Council. It was noted that the path from the church field to Pelynt needs some work. County Cllr Pugh will discuss with Pelynt Parish Council.
